## **BACK GROUND**

Fawaz Children Foundation is a Non -Governmental Organization established in 2018 with an aim of empowering children and communities based on humanitarian values and equal opportunities for socio-economic growth for sustainable development.

It is legally registered in accordance with the Laws of the Republic of Uganda and was issued with a license certificate number 7528 and permit umber 8997 by the Uganda Non-Governmental Organizations Bureau .The Foundation supplements to Government's efforts for service delivery and also contributes to the attainment of Sustainable Development Goals. Fawaz Children Foundation is premised at Migadde Sub- County, off Bombo road, Gombe Division, Nansana Municipality Wakiso District.

Fawaz Children Foundation commits its self by witnessing the profoundly positive impact on the lives of Children and OVCs by empowering them with their families and the community to contribute and build a transformative change .The Foundation Prioritizes and targets children, Orphans other vulnerable children because

- I. Uganda has one of the youngest populations in the world with approximately a population of 50 million people (UBOS 2024)
- II. More than half of its population is children
- III. Ugandan communities traditionally and culturally absorb orphans within their extended family systems.
- IV. One in four households at least fosters an orphan however; many of these care givers are overburdened living in extreme poverty with household income below 1\$ a day.
- V. Most families lack the socio-economic capacity to provide adequate care and support to these children.

Fawaz Children Foundation is guided by 4 basic Principles that it upholds in carrying out the interventions under its 5 year Strategic Plan that include:

II. Prevention, protect and improve lives of children and communities to address pressing issues that affect them

III. Community participation where we actively involve community in our projects and engage them in ensuring that initiatives are community driven and sustainable.

IV. Transparency and accountability where we ensure that resources are used efficiently and for the intended purposes

The guiding principles are hinged on the identified strategic objectives which include:

**1.**To reduce levels of illiteracy and dropout rates for 100 identified orphans and other vulnerable children annually by providing quality education in a safe and respectful environment.

- 2.To promote and ensure that 3000 children and their families have access to health care services, food, water and sanitation every year
- 3.To increase household income levels by 20% through skills development
- 4. To reduce levels of gender based violence by providing parenting skills to 6000 families annually
- 5. To reduce on the effects of climate change by providing information on nature conservation to 500 families and stake holders.

## **HOW WE WORK**



# **OUR PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS**

- 1. The foundation acquired land in Migadde, Wakiso District under its name approximately 1 acre and has constructed a pre-primary school called Fawaz Junior School where a number of 15 orphans have been enrolled. The school operations started 2024.
- 2. The foundation sponsors a number of 10 learners in other different schools in primary and secondary
- **3.** In 2024, the foundation established and started a pre-primary school called Fawaz Junior School on approximately I acre of land in its names. The school is found where the foundation is premised. A number of 15 orphans and other vulnerable children have been enrolled.
- 4. More than 40 parents have been trained on the importance parental involvement in a child's education

### **Skills development**

- 1. More than 20 women and men have been trained in income generating projects
- 2. More than 30 people have been trained in parenting skills

#### **Water and sanitation**

- 1) A number of 4 bore holes have been drilled and constructed in wakiso District
- 2) Implemented a project on hand washing campaign and more than 50 people have been sensitized

### **Disaster and humanitarian relief**

1) More than 200 families were supported during COVID19

### **Health and nutrition**

- I. More than 20 families are supported with food and other basic needs every week
- II. A number of 10 people who had eye problems were operated with support from Parkistan overseas eye clinic at a free cost

### Other support and programmes implemented

- 1. A number of 3 mosques have been constructed
- 2. 1 Muslim cemetery is under construction
- 3. More than 50 families were supported during the holy month of Ramadan

#### **Planned activities**

- 1. Construction of more classes that can accommodate approximately 600 learners from nursery to primary seven with a boarding section.
- 2. Networking and partnering with stakeholders and agencies with common goals and objectives
- 3. Capacity building in our areas of operation
- 4. Sponsoring of 300 orphans and other vulnerable children every year
- 5. Construction of a skills development center that can train a number of 100 trainees annually
- 6. Construction of a health centers in 3 districts where we operate
- 7. Support our alumina in secondary level and higher institutions of learning
- 8. Extending our reach, support and services to registered districts in all our thematic areas
- 9. Construction of more than 10 mosques in 3 years
